






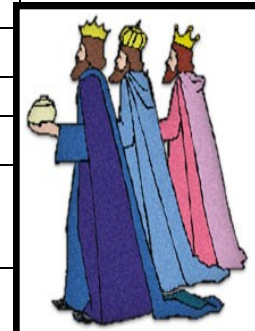

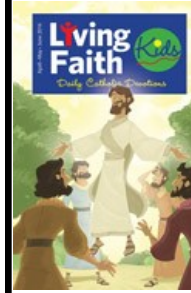

### ST. JAMES BASILICA TABERNACLE SOCIETY TO HOST EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES PROGRAM

Documented and Vatican approved Eucharist miracles have occurred and are still occurring the world over. With the diligent work of a teenaged boy, 152 Eucharist miracles have been published and will be on display at a special program at

**St. James Basilica in Jamestown on Monday January 14 at 7:00PM.**

Mr. Earl Markley, from Sioux Falls, SD, has been given specific permission by his Bishop to present this program in as many parishes as possible.

With an extensive assortment of photographs and historical descriptions, the exhibition presents some of the principal Eucharistic Miracles that took place throughout the ages in various countries of the world and which have been recognized, approved and documented by the Vatican. By means of the panels and booklet pages, one can "virtually visit" the places where the miracles took place. The current exhibition includes 153 panels that are used to explain 152 Eucharistic Miracles.

The exhibition has already visited well over 3000 parishes in Italy, the USA, Canada and in many other countries as well and has been translated into numerous languages.
